MIke Stokely Memorial Foundation:

The Foundation was formed to allow those who wished to show their appreciation for Mike's sacrifice and support for his family through donating to help kids in need have books and kids to go to college.

- Evan Marshall Memorial Scholarship Fund .

The Evan Andrew Marshall Memorial Scholarship Fund is a non-profit corporation that provides educational scholarships for the children of American servicemen and women who are casualties of the war in Iraq, so that these children can meet their full potential and build a better life for themselves.

The Matthew Freeman Project :

Pens & Paper for Peace is a not-for-profit charitable organization dedicated to collecting pens, paper, and other school supplies in cities and towns across the United States and sending them to U.S. military personnel for distribution in Afghanistan, Iraq, and other war-torn countries where children's education has been interrupted by armed conflict.

- Noah Harris Fund

The mission of the fund is to promote Noah's commitment to service, people, and community so that his example will continue to inspire citizens of Georgia and America to stand up for the values which have made this country a beacon of hope, liberty, and justice. - Ashley Henderson Huff Memorial Scholarship for Courage and Patriotism :

Ashley died a hero on September 19, 2006, when she was killed by a suicide car bomber while on patrol in her humvee. Ashley was only six weeks away from coming home to her family and her husband Brian, whom she had married just before her deployment. To celebrate Ashley's life and commemorate her sacrifice for her country, the Sigma Kappa Foundation has established this scholarship.

Whitlock Foundation :

The Captain Nicholas Schade Whitlock Foundation is a 501(c)3 organization created by Nick's family and friends to honor his life, service, and memory by investing in the futures of individuals who display the values most important to Nick: leadership, integrity and self-less service, and giving back to communities that shaped and nurtured these values in Nick's own life.

- Bremen Educational Foundation :

The Bremen High School Class of 2002 approached the school system with the idea to raise funds to purchase/construct a new scoreboard for the high school stadium. Further, the Class of 2002 wants to raise the funds in honor of their classmate Paul Saylor. On August 15, 2005, Army Sergeant Paul Saylor died while serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom. <u>LT Helton Memorial Foundation, Inc</u> :

This organization works to support a scholarship as well as the installation of a "Fallen Heroes Memorial" in Monroe, GA. The Memorial will stand to honor all veterans who have served in Iraq/Afghanistan war, and to honor and remember those who fell during their service to our country. The Joseph Helton Leadership Scholarship Fund works to support college students who are in the pursuit of a military career.

- The EOD1 Joseph "Adam" McSween Memorial Scholarship:

Explosive Ordnance Disposal First Class (EWS/SW) Joseph Adam McSween was killed in action on the 6th day of April, 2007 in the city of Hawijak, Iraq during combat operations while supporting Operation IRAQI FREEDOM from Combat Operating Base Speicher in Kirkuk Providence. Petty Officer McSween was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star Medal with Combat Distinguishing Device for Valor and Purple Heart. Funds raised are used for the recruitment of students to attend Georgia Christian High School.
